ARTICULATION AGREEMENT LEADING TO A B.S. IN NURSING

BETWEEN WEST VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY AT PARKERSBURG AND BRIDGEVALLEY COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE

West Virginia University at Parkersburg and BridgeValley Community and Technical College in order to promote the transfer of students between the two institutions seeking degrees in Nursing and thereby increase educational opportunities for students in West Virginia, establish this articulated program leading to the B.S.N. degree in Nursing to be granted by West Virginia University at Parkersburg. This articulation agreement stipulates a course of study leading to an A.A.S. degree in Nursing, which, if satisfactorily completed by students at the BridgeValley Community and Technical College, will allow them to transfer into West Virginia University at Parkersburg and obtain the B.S. degree in Nursing upon the successful completion of the program outlined in the articulation agreement.

West Virginia University at Parkersburg and BridgeValley Community and Technical College agree to monitor and support the provisions of this agreement to ensure consistency and program quality and transferability of the benefit of the students of both institutions. West Virginia University at Parkersburg and BridgeValley Community and Technical College agree to coordinate changes in the course content or requirements for any courses listed in the articulation agreement in order to ensure continued comparability between the courses offered on each campus. West Virginia University at Parkersburg and BridgeValley Community and Technical College agree to renegotiate this agreement as necessary due to changes in curriculum or graduation requirements implemented by either institution. This process will be the responsibility of the appropriate deans at both institutions.

Students pursuing the B.S. in Nursing through the articulation agreement will be bound by the curriculum sheets in effect at the time they are officially accepted into the articulated program. The attached curriculum sheet dated September 1, 2015 will be in effect until officially changed and agreed upon by both institutions.
