BridgeValley Offers Courses Allowing Area High School Students to Get a Head Start on College

Montgomery, W.Va. – For the past few years, hundreds of area high school students interested in getting a head start on their college education have been able to enroll in college courses offered by BridgeValley Community and Technical College. Students take these courses either at their local high school or vocational center, and the courses are taught by the adjuncts from BridgeValley. These courses, which have been reviewed and approved by appropriate BridgeValley faculty, mirror those offered at the BridgeValley campus for both content and outcomes. BridgeValley is fully accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.

High school students take the courses at a discounted rate, which is typically less than 1/3 the normal price and in some cases they are totally free! Upon passing the course, the student will receive BridgeValley credits for the courses taken and can use these credits in a BridgeValley program or as transfer college credits. Many high school students eventually come to BridgeValley to pursue their Associate's degrees. In this way, both the students and BridgeValley benefit from the early admission program.

Courses offered include English 101/102, Sociology, Psychology, Life-Span Psychology, College Algebra, First-Year Experience, Spanish, French and American Sign Language (4 semesters). The participating schools have included all career-technical centers and many high schools in BridgeValley's service region, as well as private schools and home-schooled students.

Since it started, the program has grown significantly in the range of courses offered and the number of participating schools—and it has grown over 1,000 percent in the number of students enrolled.
